The Fund aims to provide investors with long-term capital appreciation by investing in Shariah-compliant investments with exposure to the Greater China region.

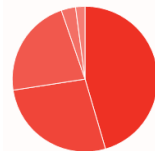

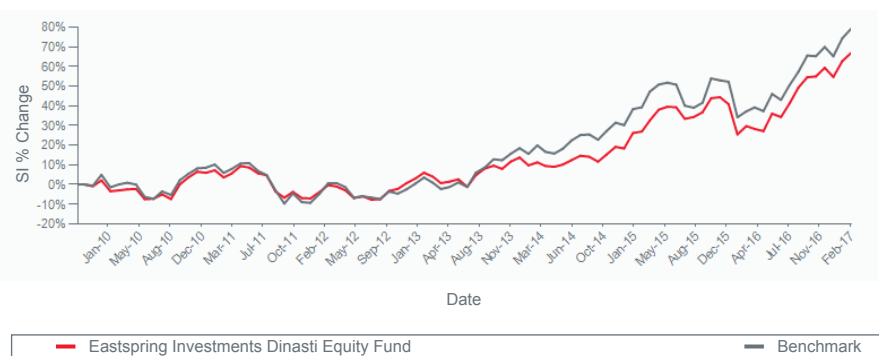

It uses investors-centred criteria to deliver a simple, clear description of a fund's success in meeting certain goals, such as preserving capital or building wealth through consistent strong returns.

Lipper Leader ratings are derived from highly sophisticated formulas that analyse funds against clearly defined criteria. Each fund is ranked against its peers based on the metric used (such as Total Return or Expense), and then the top 20% of funds in that ranking receive the Lipper Leader designation. Lipper Leaders measures are not predictive of future performance, but they do provide context and perspective for making knowledgeable fund investment decisions.

FUND MANAGER'S COMMENTARY

February was a positive month for Asian equities in general, including the Greater China markets with Taiwan outperforming the other Greater China markets.

The Morgan Stanley Capital International ("MSCI") China Index rose 3.57% while the China Securities Index ("CSI") 300 index rose 1.91% as the Renminbi stabilised and economic data continue to show strong momentum. The National Bureau of Statistics ("NBS") manufacturing Purchasing Managers Index ("PMI") was 51.6 in February while the Caixin PMI was 51.7, both showing improvements over January's print. Inflation was also higher with January CPI inflation up 2.5% y/y. With the economy now showing signs of picking up steam, the government's attention has now turned to minimising financial risk and a further deleveraging of the economy. Top performing sectors were consumer discretionary, financials and real estate.

In Hong Kong, the Hang Seng Index was up 1.63% while the Hang Seng China Enterprises Index was up 5.04%. Property stocks continue to do well amidst the strong primary residential sell-through rates where the property price tracking index, Centa-City leading index rose 1.3% in February to its all-time high. Financial stocks continue to lead the Hang Seng China Enterprises Index ("HSCEI") higher.

Taiwan Stock Exchange ("TWSE") index was up by 3.2% for the month. Apple supply chain names once again led the performance of the market, as investors continue to factor in high expectations of unit growth for the iPhone 8 cycle. Foreign investors were net equity buyers of USD 1.6 billion in February.

For the month under review, the fund returned 2.60%, underperforming the benchmark's return of 2.85% due to the fund's overweight position in the telecommunications sector that underperformed the broader market sectors.

Based on the Fund's portfolio returns as at 31 January 2017, the Volatility Factor (VF) for this Fund is 12.1 and is classified as "Very High" (Source: Lipper). "Very High" generally includes funds with VF that are higher than 10.605. The VF means that there is a possibility for the Fund in generating an upside return or downside return around this VF. The Volatility Class (VC) is assigned by Lipper based on quintile ranks of VF for qualified funds. VF is subject to monthly revision and VC will be revised every six (6) months. The VF for the Fund may be higher or lower than the VC, depending on the market conditions. The Fund's portfolio may have changed since this date and there is no guarantee that the Fund will continue to have the same VF or VC in the future. Presently, only funds launched in the market for at least 36 months will display the VF and its VC.
