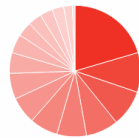

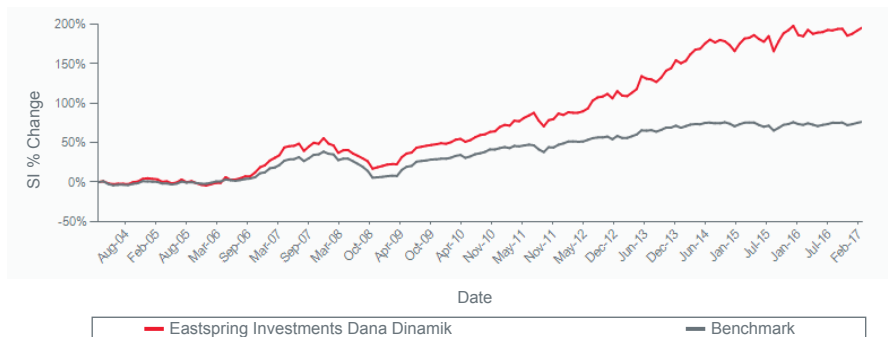

FUND MANAGER'S COMMENTARY

Equity:
Global markets rallied in the month of February as the positive sentiment from January carried forward. US corporates reporting 4Q 2016 results in February generally surprised the market with a higher percentage of companies beating consensus earnings expectations for their 4Q results, in particular the Technology related companies and Health care. China's central bank raised overnight interest rates for its standing lending facility ("SLF") loans to 3.1% from 2.75%, post the one-week Lunar New Year holiday break, which saw the Chinese Yuan ("CNY") firmer against the US Dollar. Malaysian equities also had a positive month in tandem with regional markets. Corporate results reporting season for the 4Q 2016 came in mostly inline or slightly above expectations, as compared to previous quarters. The upside surprise came from gaming, plantation, aviation and selected consumer related stocks, some disappointments from the banking and telco stocks. The FTSE Bursa Malaysia ("FBM") Shariah Emas Index ended the month higher at 1.31% mom to close at 12,387.75 points. The broader market gained 1.78% outperforming the FBM Shariah Emas Index. All sectors registered positive performances during the month, with the best performing sector being Technology (+6.9%), benefiting from the strong US dollar sales, and Property (+4.76%). The worst performing sector was Industrial (+0.9%) and Consumer (+1.41%). The FBM Small Cap Index gained 2.18%. Average value traded on Bursa in February was up 18.2% mom to RM2.280bn despite being a shorter trading month.

Fixed Income:
As at end February, the chances of the US Federal Reserve ("Fed") hiking rates during its March 14-15 meeting have been creeping higher as the probability now stood at 50% based on market-implied chance. Fed Chairwomen emphasized that rates should increase in a gradual fashion this year, adding that it would be "unwise" to wait too long to hike. Nevertheless, it remains to be seen whether the Fed will hike rates in March or delve further into the potential effects of extra fiscal stimulus as promised by the Trump's administration. Separately, there could be global uncertainty rising from the United Kingdom ("UK") as the time for the British Government to officially notify the European Union ("EU") on its intention to leave the Union is almost up. The Government will need to invoke Article 50 of the Treaty of Lisbon by end of March as voted by its citizens in the "Brexit" referendum and then only the UK Government can start its complex negotiations to exit the European Union. At this juncture, it is hard to predict the terms of the new deal and its impact on the global economy. On the domestic front, Bank Negara Malaysia ("BNM") held the Overnight Policy Rate ("OPR") at 3.00% during its March's Monetary Policy Committee meeting. BNM acknowledged that there are improvements in the global economy and highlighted evidence of a recovery in global trade. Separately, BNM expects headline inflation to trend higher in 2017 on the back of higher fuel prices but believes that the relatively high headline inflation to moderate in the second half of 2017. Given the current domestic economic environment, we believe that BNM would leave the OPR rate unchanged in the near term, and that any change to the Overnight Policy rate would depend on BNM's future expectation of domestic growth and inflation. There will be around RM10.5 billion of Malaysian Government Securities ("MGS")/MGII maturing in March 2017. This could see some volatility in yields as investors may decide to reinvest or not to reinvest into government bonds. Furthermore, Malaysian sovereign bond market may experience some volatility due to the uncertainty of Fed rate hike which may push yields higher. MYR corporate bond market is expected to see decent supply in the pipeline in the coming months. Potential issuers are expected to tap the market as yields have remained relatively stable. However, we believe corporates will remain cautious towards expansion or capex spending in 2017 given uncertainties surrounding global and local economic outlooks and increasing expectations of hawkish monetary policy from major central banks.

Based on the Fund's portfolio returns as at 31 January 2017, the Volatility Factor (VF) for this Fund is 8.1 and is classified as "High" (Source: Lipper). "High" generally includes funds with VF that are higher than 8.015 but not more than 10.605. The VF means that there is a possibility for the Fund in generating an upside return or downside return around this VF. The Volatility Class (VC) is assigned by Lipper based on quintile ranks of VF for qualified funds. VF is subject to monthly revision and VC will be revised every six (6) months. The VF for the Fund may be higher or lower than the VC, depending on the market conditions. The Fund's portfolio may have changed since this date and there is no guarantee that the Fund will continue to have the same VF or VC in the future. Presently, only funds launched in the market for at least 36 months will display the VF and its VC.
