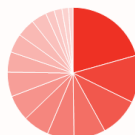

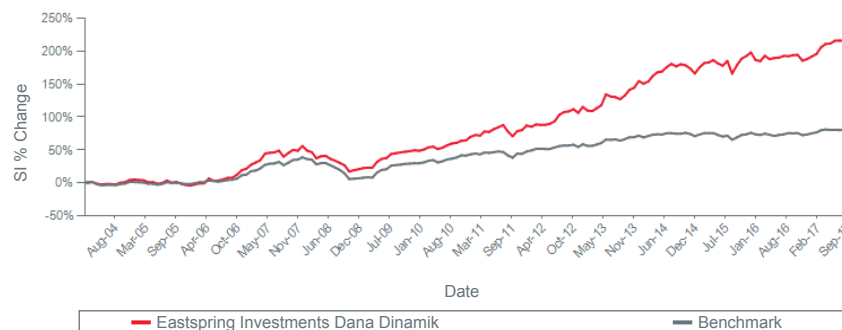

FUND MANAGER'S COMMENTARY

Equity:
The Malaysian equity market rebounded early in the month, but succumbed to selling pressure after mid-month, when the Federal Reserve ("Fed") signaled one more rate hike towards the year end. The US markets were hampered by the Hurricane Irma, which hit the east coast of United States so soon after the devastating effects of Hurricane Harvey. The launch of Apple's Iphone X and Iphone 8 was a little disappointing given the minimal obvious differences between the Iphone 7 and Iphone 8, and the high price point of the Iphone X. September saw another month of net foreign outflows of RM0.8bn, compared to RM0.24bn outflows in August.

The FTSE Bursa Malaysia Index ("FBM") Shariah Emas Index ended the month higher at 0.38% mom to close at 12,797.37 points. The broader market declined by 0.62%, underperforming the FBM Shariah Emas Index. The best performing sectors were Industrial Production (+1.78%) and Property (+0.7%), whilst the worst performing sectors were Technology (-2.14%) and Finance (-1.98%). Technology stocks tumbled on the disappointment from the Iphone launch and Finance stocks were affected by the sale of CIMB stake by Tokyo-Mitsubishi UFJ. The FBM Small Cap Index gained 1.22%. Average value traded on Bursa in September was RM2.5b slightly higher than RM2.148m in August.

Fixed Income:
The US Federal Reserve ("Fed") left its federal funds rate unchanged at 1.00% - 1.25% in September's Federal Open Market Committee ("FOMC") meeting and indicated that one more rate hike was on the table for the current fiscal year as the Fed remains optimistic on the economy.

Separately, the Fed confirmed that it will wind down its balance sheet as the central bank is expected to start reducing its balance sheet in October. The Fed will trim its reinvestments by USD10bn in October and raising that amount gradually to USD50bn in the months to come.

On the domestic front, investors will be scrutinising the upcoming Budget 2018 which will be tabled by the Malaysian Government on 27th October. The Government is expected to maintain its fiscal prudence to avoid any risk of sovereign ratings downgrade and at the same time continue to address the welfare of the people and needs for nation's growth.

Malaysia's sovereign bond market may experience some volatility as there will be large government bond maturities in the next two months. MYR corporate bond market is expected to see slower supply in the pipeline as investors are taking a "wait and see" approach.

Based on the Fund's portfolio returns as at 31 August 2017, the Volatility Factor (VF) for this Fund is 7.9 and is classified as "Moderate" (Source: Lipper). "Moderate" generally includes funds with VF that are higher than 6.225 but not more than 8.225. The VF means that there is a possibility for the Fund in generating an upside return or downside return around this VF. The Volatility Class (VC) is assigned by Lipper based on quintile ranks of VF for qualified funds. VF is subject to monthly revision and VC will be revised every six (6) months. The VF for the Fund may be higher or lower than the VC, depending on the market conditions. The Fund's portfolio may have changed since this date and there is no guarantee that the Fund will continue to have the same VF or VC in the future. Presently, only funds launched in the market for at least 36 months will display the VF and its VC.
