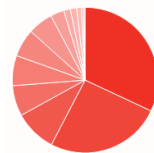

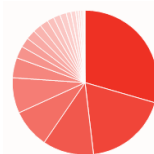
### TARGET FUND ASSET ALLOCATION

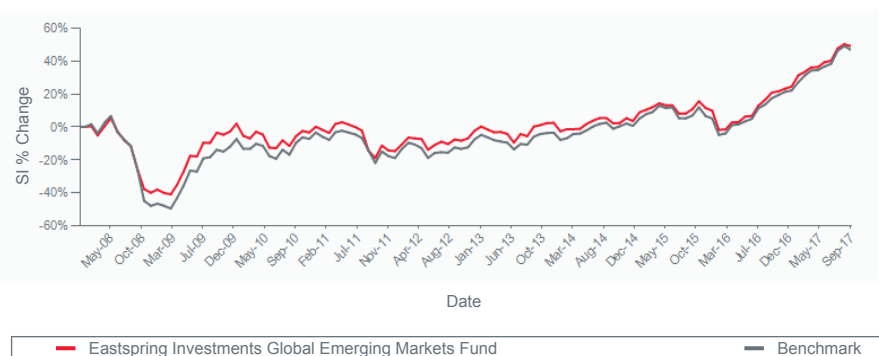

The Lipper Leaders Ratings System is a set of tools that guide investors and their advisors to select funds that suit individual investment styles and goals. It uses investors-centred criteria to deliver a simple, clear description of a fund's success in meeting certain goals, such as preserving capital or building wealth through consistent strong returns.

Lipper Leader ratings are derived from highly sophisticated formulas that analyse funds against clearly defined criteria. Each fund is ranked against its peers based on the metric used (such as Total Return or Expense), and then the top 20% of funds in that ranking receive the Lipper Leader designation. Lipper Leaders measures are not predictive of future performance, but they do provide context and perspective for making knowledgeable fund investment decisions.

### FUND MANAGER'S COMMENTARY

The fund outperformed the benchmark, with country allocation and stock selection both contributing positively.

From a country perspective, the underweight to South Africa and the overweight to Russia were the key contributors. Being underweight to India was also beneficial.

At a stock level, selection in Korea added the most to relative returns, in particular the overweight to videogame publisher NCsoft. After first half earnings results disappointed, the stock rallied in September as new game sales exceeded expectations, improving the outlook for Q3 and Q4. The overweight to Samsung Electronics also worked well amid ongoing strength in DRAM and NAND prices. In Russia, the off-index holdings in supermarket operator X5 Retail Group and mobile operator Megafon were the largest contributors. X5 gained as the company announced plans to pay a dividend for the first time. It will target a payout ratio of 25% of net income. Megafon rallied sharply following weak performance in recent months. Valuations were cheap and the outlook for earnings and dividends is improving. In contrast, stock selection in China was negative. This included the overweight to China Pacific Insurance Group. The stock gave back recent gains, amid a pullback in the insurance sector in China. This was on concerns over a potential easing in near-term policy.

Based on the Fund's portfolio returns as at 31 August 2017, the Volatility Factor (VF) for this Fund is 11.0 and is classified as "High" (Source: Lipper). The Volatility Class (VC) is assigned by Lipper based on quintile ranks of VF for qualified funds. VF is subject to monthly revision and VC will be revised every six (6) months. The Fund's portfolio may have changed since this date and there is no guarantee that the Fund will continue to have the same VF or VC in the future. Presently, only funds launched in the market for at least 36 months will display the VF and its VC.
