



The Lipper Leaders Ratings System is a set of tools that guide investors and their advisors to select funds that suit individual investment styles and goals. It uses investors-centred criteria to deliver a simple, clear description of a fund's success in meeting certain goals, such as preserving capital or building wealth through consistent strong returns.

Lipper Leader ratings are derived from highly sophisticated formulas that analyse funds against clearly defined criteria. Each fund is ranked against its peers based on the metric used (such as Total Return or Expense), and then the top 20% of funds in that ranking receive the Lipper Leader designation. Lipper Leaders measures are not predictive of future performance, but they do provide context and perspective for making knowledgeable fund investment decisions.

FUND MANAGER'S COMMENTARY

Equity:

Global stock markets ended the year almost on a perfect high with major developed market indices reaching record closes on the penultimate trading day of the year. However, the month also saw a sector rotation out of technology and into cyclicals, principally a result of the passage of tax reform in the US, which could potentially lead to higher dividends and share buybacks.

Emerging Markets again outperformed Developed Markets, with Latin America performing best among regional exchanges in the Morgan Stanley Capital International Emerging Markets ("MSCI EM") universe. For Asia, the sector rotation meant the tech-heavy north Asia indices underperformed south-east Asia although all major indices in Asia again made progress, with many touching ten-year highs.

China indices were rather subdued as investors chose to take profits as the People's Bank of China ("PBOC") raised its one-year marginal lending rate (OMO) by 5bps, and began regulating against online micro-lenders and liquidity requirements for the major banks.

India, on the other hand, was a top performer with MSCI India returning 5% in USD terms after the market friendly Bharatiya Janata Party won two key state elections paving the way for a growth orientated national budget to be announced later this year. Rural and infrastructure levered stocks rallied hard on expectations of a major spending push by the government ahead of the Union Budget on 1st February.

Fixed Income:

In December's Federal Open Market Committee ("FOMC") meeting, the US Federal Reserve ("Fed") raised its federal funds rate by 25bps to 1.25%-1.50% from 1.00%-1.25%. The Fed followed through on an expected interest-rate increase but raised their forecast for economic growth in 2018 to 2.5% from 2.1%. Fed policymakers also maintained its forecast of three rate hikes in 2018.

On the domestic front, the first Monetary Policy Committee ("MPC") meeting for 2018 will be held on 25 January. Previously, Bank Negara Malaysia ("BNM") commented that the current level of the Overnight Policy Rate ("OPR") provides a degree of monetary accommodativeness. However, BNM hinted that they may consider reviewing the current degree of monetary policy accommodation. As such, there is a possibility that Bank Negara may raise the Overnight Policy Rate ("OPR") in 2018 given the recent favourable economic growth and stable core inflation.

Domestic corporate bond market is expected to see better supply in the pipeline in the coming months as issuers are rushing to tap the market in expectation of rising interest rates. This is mainly due to the prospects for tighter monetary policy in the advanced countries.

Based on the Fund's portfolio returns as at 30 November 2017, the Volatility Factor (VF) for this Fund is 5.0 and is classified as "Low" (Source: Lipper). "Low" generally includes funds with VF that are higher than 1.870 but not more than 6.225. The VF means that there is a possibility for the Fund in generating an upside return or downside return around this VF. The Volatility Class (VC) is assigned by Lipper based on quintile ranks of VF for qualified funds. VF is subject to monthly revision and VC will be revised every six (6) months. The VF for the Fund may be higher or lower than the VC, depending on the market conditions. The Fund's portfolio may have changed since this date and there is no guarantee that the Fund will continue to have the same VF or VC in the future. Presently, only funds launched in the market for at least 36 months will display the VF and its VC.
