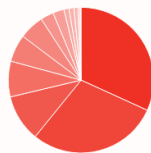

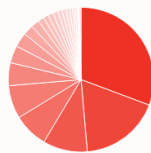
### TARGET FUND ASSET ALLOCATION

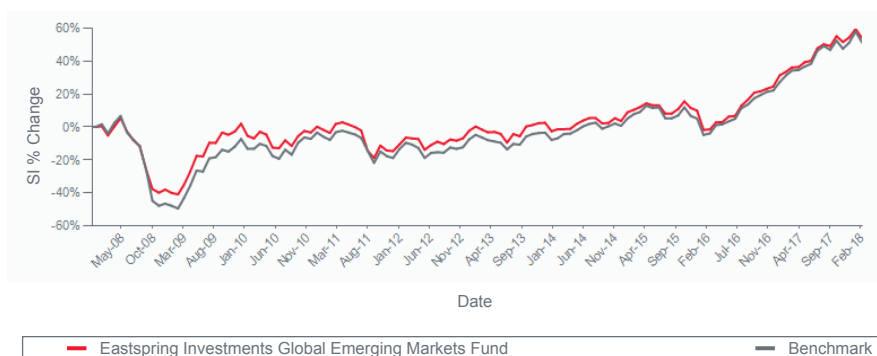

The Lipper Leaders Ratings System is a set of tools that guide investors and their advisors to select funds that suit individual investment styles and goals. It uses investors-centred criteria to deliver a simple, clear description of a fund's success in meeting certain goals, such as preserving capital or building wealth through consistent strong returns.

Lipper Leader ratings are derived from highly sophisticated formulas that analyse funds against clearly defined criteria. Each fund is ranked against its peers based on the metric used (such as Total Return or Expense), and then the top 20% of funds in that ranking receive the Lipper Leader designation. Lipper Leaders measures are not predictive of future performance, but they do provide context and perspective for making knowledgeable fund investment decisions.

### FUND MANAGER'S COMMENTARY

The fund returned 8.1% (A Acc Share class), underperforming the Morgan Stanley Capital International ("MSCI") Emerging Markets Index (+8.3%). On a gross underlying basis, the fund marginally outperformed, supported by positive country allocation.

The overweight to Russia and the underweights to South Africa and India were the main contributors. Zero-weights to Indonesia and the Philippines also added value. In contrast, being overweight to Korea was negative.

Stock selection detracted, primarily in Korea and Brazil. In Korea, a zero-weight to biopharmaceutical company Celltrion was the main headwind as the stock rallied sharply on positive earnings revisions. The overweight to Samsung Electronics was also negative. The stock fell as weak global smartphone sales raised concerns over the outlook for component prices. In Brazil, the overweights to concessions operator CCR and pharmacy business Raia Drogasil were the largest detractors. CCR finished in positive territory but lagged the wider market rally amid concern over delays to its M & A plans. Raia Drogasil lost value, in part due to concerns over its competitive environment which led it to reduce its earnings guidance for 2018.

Based on the Fund's portfolio returns as at 31 January 2018, the Volatility Factor (VF) for this Fund is 10.8 and is classified as "Very High" (Source: Lipper). "Very High" generally includes funds with VF that are higher than 10.615. The VF means that there is a possibility for the Fund in generating an upside return or downside return around this VF. The Volatility Class (VC) is assigned by Lipper based on quintile ranks of VF for qualified funds. VF is subject to monthly revision and VC will be revised every six (6) months. The VF for the Fund may be higher or lower than the VC, depending on the market conditions. The Fund's portfolio may have changed since this date and there is no guarantee that the Fund will continue to have the same VF or VC in the future. Presently, only funds launched in the market for at least 36 months will display the VF and its VC.
