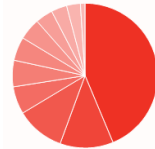

The Fund aims to provide investors with long-term capital appreciation by investing in Shariah-compliant investments with exposure to the Greater China region.

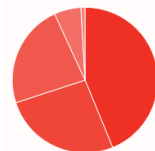

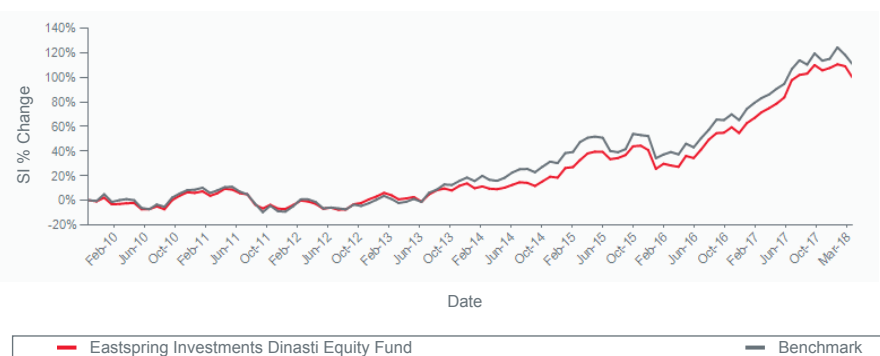

The Lipper Leaders Ratings System is a set of tools that guide investors and their advisors to select funds that suit individual investment styles and goals. It uses investors-centred criteria to deliver a simple, clear description of a fund's success in meeting certain goals, such as preserving capital or building wealth through consistent strong returns.

Lipper Leader ratings are derived from highly sophisticated formulas that analyse funds against clearly defined criteria. Each fund is ranked against its peers based on the metric used (such as Total Return or Expense), and then the top 20% of funds in that ranking receive the Lipper Leader designation. Lipper Leaders measures are not predictive of future performance, but they do provide context and perspective for making knowledgeable fund investment decisions.

### FUND MANAGER'S COMMENTARY

For the second consecutive month in a row, Greater China markets ended lower overall as geopolitical risks surrounding trade wars between the United States and China increased volatility and lowered risk appetite. Equity markets fell after United States ("US") president Trump announced a USD 50 billion list of tariffs on Chinese goods imported into the country, and raised the possibility of an extended trade war between the world's 2 biggest economies.

Morgan Stanley Capital International ("MSCI") China was down 3.01% during the month, underperforming the broader MSCI Asia ex-Japan markets due its higher beta nature. In Hong Kong, the Hang Seng Index fell 2.44% while the Hang Seng China Enterprise Index fell 3.1% against this backdrop. In China, the National Policy Congress meetings concluded where it announced the removal of presidential term limits, announced new appointment of key personnel in the government and also further commitment to institutional reforms. The China Securities Regulatory Commission ("CSRC") also announced a pilot depository receipts program to encourage high tech Chinese companies abroad to list shares in the mainland.

In Taiwan, the Taiwan TAIEX index rose 1.33% during the month and outperformed other Greater China markets. There were further earnings downgrades amongst Apple supply chain names on news that iPhone sales continue to show signs of weakness. During the month, there were also reports that Apple was looking to diversify its reliance on organic light emitting diodes ("OLED") display screens by exploring micro light emitting diode ("LED") technology. The stock market however was resilient as the broader technology sector continued to see robust demand driven by other areas such as datacenters and memory.

For the month under review, the fund returned -4.23%, underperforming the benchmark's return of -3.28% due to stock selection in the consumer discretionary sector.

Based on the Fund's portfolio returns as at 28 February 2018, the Volatility Factor (VF) for this Fund is 12.1 and is classified as "Very High" (Source: Lipper). "Very High" generally includes funds with VF that are higher than 10.615. The VF means that there is a possibility for the Fund in generating an upside return or downside return around this VF. The Volatility Class (VC) is assigned by Lipper based on quintile ranks of VF for qualified funds. VF is subject to monthly revision and VC will be revised every six (6) months. The VF for the Fund may be higher or lower than the VC, depending on the market conditions. The Fund's portfolio may have changed since this date and there is no guarantee that the Fund will continue to have the same VF or VC in the future. Presently, only funds launched in the market for at least 36 months will display the VF and its VC.
