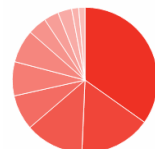

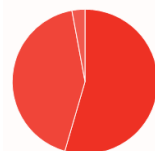

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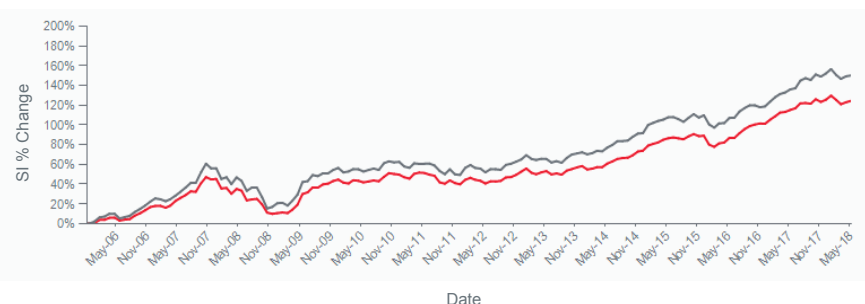

Each fund is ranked against its peers based on the metric used (such as Total Return or Expense), and then the top 20% of funds in that ranking receive the Lipper Leader designation. FUND MANAGER'S COMMENTARY

Equity:
Global Equity markets dipped into the end of the month when domestic political developments in Italy, Brazil and elsewhere combined with concerns over developing economy debt levels sent many indices lower, particularly in emerging markets. MSCI China markedly outperformed and ended with a gain of 1.9% in USD terms. The country shrugged off concerns on trade and a rising debt default rate amid resilient economic data and 1Q18 earnings. Notably, the manufacturing sector grew at the fastest pace in eight months, with the official manufacturing PMI in April rising to 51.9 from 51.4. During the month, northbound Stock Connect flows also rose to a historical high, ahead of the MSCI A-share inclusion.

MSCI India lost 3.6% in USD terms to underperform Asia. Macro developments weighed with the sustained high price of oil; currency and bond markets were also under pressure. Within MSCI India, most sectors ended the month lower. Healthcare and Telecom were the key laggards, while Consumer Staples and Utilities ended flat to slightly higher. Key economic data released during the month were mixed – first-quarter (calendar 2018) GDP expanded 7.7% year-on-year (YoY), beating forecasts. April inflation also paced to faster-than-expected 4.6% YoY from 4.3% in March on the back of a strong core print. Conversely, Industrial Production missed estimates in March, rising 4.4% YoY compared with a 7.1% rise in February.

Fixed Income:

In the May meeting, the US Federal Reserve ("Fed") held rates unchanged at 1.50%-1.75% after it raised its interest rates by 25bps in March. The Fed expects that economic conditions to evolve in a manner that will warrant further gradual increases in the federal funds rate. As such, the Fed is expected to follow through its hike rate path with at least another two rate hikes this year.

On the domestic front, the Malaysian bond market has been volatile since the recent general elections ("GE14") as the new government has unveiled the country's "real" fiscal position coupled with new economic policies such as the abolishment of Government Service Tax ("GST") and the continuity of fuel subsidies. Nevertheless, the Government has reiterated it will continue its effort to reduce debt while controlling spending.

There will be two government bond auctions in June, a new 20-year MGS benchmark security and a re-opening of 15-year MGII, and there is no MGS/GII maturity during the month. Malaysia's sovereign bond market is expected to be volatile as foreign investors continue to remain cautious on Malaysia. Separately, MYR corporate bond market is expected to see continuous decent supply in the pipeline in the coming month as issuers are eager to tap the market after being sidelined in May due to elections.

Based on the Fund's portfolio returns as at 30 April 2018, the Volatility Factor (VF) for this Fund is 5.3 and is classified as "Low" (Source: Lipper). "Low" generally includes funds with VF that are higher than 1.785 but not more than 6.045. The VF means that there is a possibility for the Fund in generating an upside return or downside return around this VF. The Volatility Class (VC) is assigned by Lipper based on quintile ranks of VF for qualified funds. VF is subject to monthly revision and VC will be revised every six (6) months. The VF for the Fund may be higher or lower than the VC, depending on the market conditions. The Fund's portfolio may have changed since this date and there is no guarantee that the Fund will continue to have the same VF or VC in the future. Presently, only funds launched in the market for at least 36 months will display the VF and its VC.
